Here's what that means:

- Our expenses were a bit higher in March but lower expenses in January and February still allow us to have a surplus of \$4,894.
- Our accumulated deficit as a church is at \$38,783 and we started the year with an accumulated deficit deficit of \$43,677.
- As of March 15, we are still just under \$100,000 short of reaching our \$360,000 Pavilion Project budget.
- To reach our annual budget, we need to average \$7,692/week in offerings to the General Fund. We were averaging \$7,183 at the end of March (13 weeks). We also know that after 16 weeks we have increased that to \$7597/week. (Our income report comes to us weekly, monthly reports take longer to produce.)
- Our Missions giving goal for 2021 is \$22,000 and we've received \$4,510 toward that goal at the time of this statement.(Find out about who we support: freedomkw.com/missions.) We can also report that as of April 18, we have almost received \$10,000 toward that goal!

We know that this past year has created some incredible opportunities to reach people in our community with the message of Christ and the love of His Church. And while we were in the recording studio and in editing mode we also were able to tell stories from our church family in the #sothisisJesus series of videos. It's always incredible to hear about all the ways that God is working in people's lives and to be encouraged in our own walk with Christ. Thank you to Julie, Leanna, Jen and Lorinda (who shared live in a service)!

Rob was able to put this studio space together for under \$500, using funds from some items in the Freedom Community Centre that were no longer needed and sold on Kijiji. Win!

The new studio space is also the home for our Impact Leadership Training teaching video recordings and will be able to be used by Miss Margaret as our online Kids Church continues to go live every Sunday morning at 9:00.

Amazing? Yep! These tools are simple and very powerful and we're praying for even greater reach into our neighbourhoods as we use them.
