Here's what it means:

- With expenses running on budget and a couple of generous gifts mid-year, we have a surplus of \$67,014 for the year!
- We started the year with an accumulated deficit of (\$43,677) and as of May 2021, that deficit has been completely cleared. We now have an organizational surplus of \$23,337!
- We are just a little more than \$85,000 short of reaching our \$360,000 Pavilion Project budget. We're looking forward to finalizing our permitting process and getting an updated budget and date for construction in the coming months.
- To reach our annual budget, we need to average \$7,692/week in offerings to the General Fund. We were averaging \$9,088 at the end of August (35 weeks). We also know that after 37 weeks this has dropped slightly to \$8,897/week. We're in a good position but want to invite you to continue to invest in our General Fund so that we can maintain this position. *(Our income report comes to us weekly, monthly reports take longer to produce.)*
- Our Missions giving goal for 2021 is \$22,000 and we've received \$15,120 toward that goal. *(Find out more: freedomkw.com/missions)*

"Connect and train to make an impact."

We've been using that tag line a lot lately.
